

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

White Earth Tribal and Community College
AND
University of Minnesota Morris
600 E 4th Street
Morris, MN 56267

This form is a modified form used within the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnSCU) system.

This Agreement is entered into between **White Earth Tribal and Community College 2250 College Road, PO Box 478, Mahnomon, MN 56557** (hereinafter sending institution), and **University of Minnesota Morris (UMN Morris) 600 E 4th Street Morris, MN 56267** (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established an **Associate of Arts** (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a **Bachelor of Arts in Human Services** (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply, including grade requirements for courses and an overall GPA requirement.

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept **60** credits from the sending program. A total of **60** remain to complete the receiving program.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on **July 1, 2021** and shall remain in effect until the end date of **July 1, 2026** or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning **January 1, 2026** (within six months of the end date).
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

Instructions

Students may complete more than one sub-plan, however, each elective may only be used to satisfy the requirements of one sub-plan.





Students should complete Psy 4102 during the semester before their internship (HMSV 4896).
